



The Corps Colours



The significance, proportion and sequence when worn horizontally is as follows:

YELLOW	(Old Gold)	The coat or tunic colour of the Duke of York and Albany's Maritime Regiment of Foot in October 1664.	One Part
GREEN	(Light Infantry Green)	Perpetuates Light Infantry title.	One Part
RED	(Drummer Red)	The Infantry tunic colour until 1876.	Two Parts
BLUE	(Navy Blue)	The connection with the Royal Navy	Eight Parts <i>(2 x four)</i>
